Dear Families,

Kingswood Primary School is committed to providing high quality programs and learning experiences for every child. Your contributions enable the school and its staff to provide a creative and inspiring educational program that extends beyond the standard curriculum. Whilst the school receives funding from the Department of Education (DET) for the delivery of the standard curriculum, this funding only covers the cost of the basic curriculum program which does not include the extra programs and resources that Kingswood is known for.

The DET has implemented changes to parent payment requests and as such the fee structure for next year is vastly reduced from previous years. As a result of these changes, School Council has had no choice but to create a new voluntary contribution called the 'Student Enrichment Contribution' to offset the shortfall that the school is going to experience as a result of these changes. Without this additional per child contribution the school may not be able to continue to offer the additional programs and resources that Kingswood is known for, such as; access to technology, the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program, additional specialist classes, quality resources and additional educational supports.

Financial Support for Families

Kingswood Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports & Excursions Funding (CSEF) available to eligible parents/guardians
- State Schools Relief available for uniforms/footwear
- Local community supports – please arrange an appointment with Megan Franklyn (Acting Assistant Principal) to discuss options.
- Second hand uniform shop

Parents are advised to contact Catherine Palmer (Business Manager) about your financial situation and related difficulties in making payments. All communication regarding financial difficulties and hardship are confidential.

Payment Methods

Parents will be provided with notification of annual payment requests at the start of Term 4 each year. Reasonable notice will be given for any other payment requests during the year ie: excursions, incursions, camps and swimming.

Payment instalment options are available to all families at the school. 4 instalments are offered as follows:

- 1st instalment 30% on the 4th December 2020
- 2nd instalment 25% on the 12th February 2021
- 3rd instalment 25% on the 30th April 2021
- 4th instalment 20% on the 23rd July 2021

The following payment methods are available:

- Compass, EFTPOS/Credit Card payments, Cash, Direct deposit
- Personalised payment plan arrangement can be organised on request.

Refunds

Kingswood Primary School will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally, we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid, where those funds have already been transferred to a third party.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
